

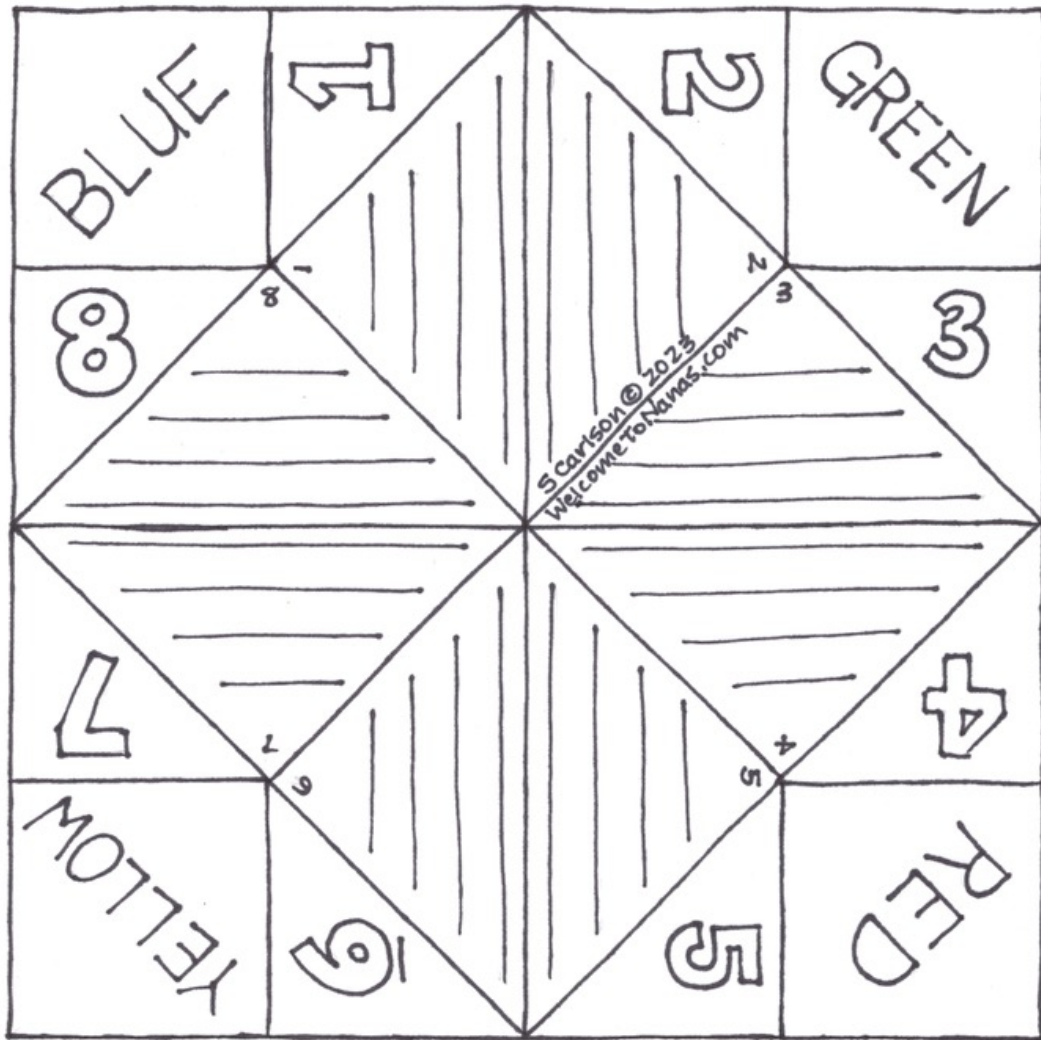
Paper Fortune Teller DIY

Instructions on how to make and play a game with your Paper Fortune Teller.

You will have a person choose a color on the front of the Paper Fortune Teller. Then you'll move the "mouth" up and down as you spell the color they have chosen.

So if they choose "RED", you open it up and down/then sideways and back together three times as you spell out "R-E-D".

Then the person will choose a number from inside the open Paper Fortune Teller "mouth" from the position it is in after you have spelled out the color.

Take the Paper Fortune Teller off your fingers and lift the flap with that number on it to see what it says. But we haven't written anything under the flaps yet!!!

OK, let's decide what game we are playing and do that next.

Lay the Paper Fortune teller down on the table and flatten it out again so that the side with the 8 numbers is on top.

You will be lifting each flap and writing something on the area underneath each number. That is what you will read to the person you are playing with when they choose that number.

There are a lot of ways to use this as a game. Here are a few ideas of things to write under the flaps.

Ask a Yes/No question- possible answers:

Yes, for sure!

No way

Maybe, maybe not

In your dreams

Of course

Wait and see

Go ask your mom

In a little while

Fun fortunes:

You will make a friend today!

You are special! Enjoy being yourself!

You are my sunshine!

Try something new! Opportunity coming!

Never give up. Cause others to smile!
